Prelude

*Call to Worship - Rachel Hackenburg devotional and Psalm 65:7-11a Tumultuous waves are too jarring and too loud.

They pop like gunfire, they scream like missiles, they weep like hunger, they groan like grief.

With every crash of another wave, boats capsize and children's cries are lost in the vast turmoil.

When the waves are unrelenting, we pray to God to calm the storms...

When the days are overwhelming, we pray to God for the gift of grace,

We pray for the dignity of a deep breath,

for the beauty of holy timeliness.

"God silences the roaring of the seas;

God silences the tumult of the peoples.

God visits the earth ... **and waters its furrows abundantly,** settling its ridges, softening it with showers, and blessing its growth.

We begin worship with a hymn of praise. Why praise? St. Francis praised God in his frailty and pain for the same reasons he praised God when he was stronger and well: because God is good, the world is beautiful, life is a relentless gift and love never ends. He praised God because he still had breath in his body, and what is breath for if not praise?

Call to Confession (Please be seated)

Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you disquieted within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my help and my God. (42:5-6) The "why" of this refrain—addressed to his own soul—is mirrored by another even more disturbing "why" question, addressed to God: "Why have you forgotten me?" (42:9). L. R. Knost has written "It's not our job to toughen our children up to face a cruel and heartless world. It's our job to raise children who will make the world a little less cruel and heartless."

Unison Prayer of Confession

We need to confess our confusion about God as the constant source of love in our hurting world as we each yearn for companionship.

God, lover of life, lover of these lives, lover of our souls, lover of our bodies, lover of all that exists: It is your love that keeps it all alive.... May we live in this love. May we never doubt this love. May we know that we are love, that we were created for love, that we are a reflection of you, that you love yourself in us and therefore we are perfectly lovable. May we never doubt this deep and abiding and perfect goodness. We are because you are.

Announcements

Next Sunday is Christ the King Sunday (the last Sunday before Advent). Christ the King Sunday began being observed in the mid 1920s, a practice instituted by Pope Pius XI out of a concern for the growing secularism and the rise of fascism in Europe following WWI. Read Revelation 1:4-8. Jesus is our prophet, priest and king and we are to follow him in those roles.

Nothing that is worth doing can be achieved in our lifetime; therefore we must be saved by hope. Nothing which is true or beautiful or good makes complete sense in any immediate context of history; therefore we must be saved by faith. Nothing we do, however virtuous, can be accomplished alone; therefore we are saved by love. No virtuous act is quite as virtuous from the standpoint of our friend or foe as it is from our standpoint. Therefore we must be saved by the final form of love which is forgiveness.
