Let us begin our worship of God with Psalm 100 - a Psalm of joy.

On your feet now - applaud God!

Bring a gift of laughter, sing yourselves into God's presence.

Know this... God made us; we didn't make God.

We're God's people, God's well-tended sheep.

Enter God's house with the password: "Thank you!"

Make yourselves at home, talking praise. Thank God. Worship God.

Call to Confession (Please be seated)

"In prayer there is a connection between what God does and what you do. You can't get forgiveness from God, for instance, without also forgiving others. If you refuse to do your part, you cut yourself off from God's part. Matthew 6:14-15 *The Message.* The Mayans use a term *in lak'ech*, which means "You are the other me." We must not restrict another person to being their former selves that we knew. **Beautiful people can emerge from broken lives.**

Unison Prayer of Confession

Bill Wilson's less famous brother, known as Dr. Bob, offered his own Third-Step prayer, Lamott pointed out:

"Dear God, I'm sorry about the mess I've made of my life. I want to turn away from all the wrong things I've ever done and all the wrong things I've ever been. Please forgive me for it all. I know you have the power to change my life and can turn me into a winner. Thank You, God, for getting my attention long enough to interest me in trying it your way. God, please take over the management of my life and everything about me. I am making this conscious decision to turn my will and my life over to your care and am asking you to please take over all parts of my life.

Declaration of Forgiveness

As water is poured in the baptismal font... "At the New Jerusalem Community in Cincinnati, "70 x 7" was painted over the main doorway. See Matthew 18:21–22 about how often we are to forgive. New mail carriers thought it was the address! It was our address, in a way. It's the distinctive hallmark of a people liberated by Christ. Community is not where forgiveness is unnecessary or unneeded. It is where forgiveness is very free to happen. And if it doesn't happen on a daily basis, at least imperfectly, there will be no community. Without forgiveness the logic of victimhood and perpetrator rules instead of the illogic of love. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy —Matthew 5:7.
