*Call to Worship

All light comes from Jesus, the "Light of the world."

Alpha Centauri is the closest star – 4.2 million light years away – 25 trillion miles!

The orbiting James Webb Space Telescope sees objects 150 million light-years in the past.

Space telescopes see into the past. We wait for the coming again of Jesus in the future.

Jesus is coming again. Let us worship God who is the same yesterday, today and tomorrow.

Call to Confession (Please be seated)

Will you let God make you an instrument of peace? Don't let peace be just a candle on an Advent wreath. Expect God to show you how to pardon those who have injured you. Expect God to give you faith today in those events where you doubt God's power. Expect God to wake you up tomorrow morning with hope instead of despair. Expect God to send you a person to light up a dark corner of your week. Yes. Let God make you an instrument of his peace *today*, during this time of worship!

Unison Prayer of Confession

We confess together, Lord. We are in trouble and often don't see it or we ignore the warning signs. We wake up feeling anxious and dwell on our worries the rest of the day. We resent others with whom we fundamentally disagree. "Other people" just don't understand how wrong they are! Show us, Lord, that our lives are not about our points of view or others' points of view. Our lives are about receiving your love for all people and passing it on. Our lives are about not obstructing your love for all people, even those I consider my enemies, even those I consider your enemies.

A Time of Silence – The Daily Encouraging Word

Throughout the Psalms, this little word *Selah* occurs seventy-one different times. It means to pause and think. There is no specific length of time attached to the pause. Instead, it seems left up to the individual. *Selah*. It's a call to rest and reflect, to be still and breathe deeply, to settle into the moment and remain for a while. The *Selah* thought appears to be at the center of quiet time with the Lord. When the Lord says, *Selah*, God is saying, "Stop doing, and sit at My feet. Just belong to Me." What an invitation!
