"Forgive us our debts." Debt has been a criminal offense for thousands of years. In ancient Greece, debtors worked as slaves for their creditors. In colonial America, some debtors were branded or whipped in public, but most were thrown in jail. In fact, debt was the only crime for which long-term imprisonment was common. The financial crisis of 1819 especially hurt farmers, and many common people were sent to debtors' prison. Senator Richard Johnson was outraged. In 1821, he was responsible for outlawing debtors' prison in Kentucky, the first state to abolish debtors' prison. "If there is among you a poor person among your neighbors... you shall not harden your heart nor clutch your hand from your poor brothers and sisters" (Deuteronomy 15:7).
