## **An Invitation our Lenten Journey Together** from *Common Prayer*

Lent began on Ash Wednesday and is a forty-day season of reflection and preparation for the death and resurrection of Jeus. During this time of repentance (not a common practice in America!) we consider the sufferings of Jesus and rethink how we take up our own crosses. It is a good season to rethink how we live and to let some things go and maybe even to develop some new holy habits as acts of love for others and yourself.

I will sing praises to you among the nations.



## **Call to Confession** (Please be seated)

Vince Amlin, "Can You Keep a Secret?" Psalm 32:3-5

Jesus did not keep his temptations secret! How else would we have known about them? No one else was there. Secrets are destructive – to families, to congregations, to countries. Secrets divide us. Secrets push us to lie to each other. "But here's the secret about secrets. They are never as powerful as when they are hidden. The moment they are shared, they begin to waste away. Share your secret temptations, and let the healing begin."
